Diocese of Sioux Falls

As of May 1, 2022

- 117 Parishes
- 3 Newman Centers
- 6 Deaneries
- 23 Catholic Schools grades PK-12


- Approximately 36,000 registered Catholic households
- Estimated 86,000 individuals

- 75 priests serving parishes in assigned ministry:
 - 70 incardinated
 - 5 religious order priests entrusted with diocesan assignments

- In addition:
 - 6 priests serve other ministries in diocese other than a parish
 - 4 priests assigned to ministries outside diocese




Sioux Falls Area Parishes





Current Registered Catholic Household Distribution





2021-2026 Total Population Percent Change






2026 Projected Total Population



Historical & Current Overall Population Demographics

- Between 2010 & 2021 across the diocese:
 - Total population grew 11.7% from 570,605 to 637,253
 - White population grew 5.4% from 510,949 to 538,776
 - Persons of color population grew 93.0% from 23,424 to 45,197
 - Hispanic population grew 91.7% from 14,861 to 28,494
 - Native American population grew 16.0% from 21,371 to 24,786
- In 2021 across the diocese:
 - White population comprised 84.5% of the total population
 - Persons of color population comprised 7.1% of the total population
 - Hispanic population comprised 4.5% of the total population
 - Native American population comprised 3.9% of the total population



Projected Overall Population Demographics

- 5-Year Population Projections (2026) across the Diocese:
 - Total population will grow 5.3% to 670,721
 - White population will grow 4.0% to 560,113
 - Persons of color population will grow 14.8% to 51,877
 - Hispanic population will grow 14.7% to 32,682
 - Native American population will grow 5.1% to 26,049
- 5-Year Density Projections (2026) across the Diocese:
 - White population will comprise 83.5% of the total population
 - Persons of color population will comprise 7.7% of the total population
 - Hispanic population will comprise 4.9% of the total population
 - Native American population will comprise 3.9% of the total population

Historical, Current & Projected Age Demographics

- Between 2010 & 2021 across the Diocese:
 - The 65 and older population was the fastest growing age cohort, growing 39.2% from 82,628 to 115,059 and was 18.1% of the total 2021 population
 - In 2021, Generation Z comprised the largest generational cohort (150,371 or 23.6% of the total population)
- 5-Year Projections (2026) across the Diocese:
 - The 65 and older population will grow 16.9% to 134,470
 - Generation Z will comprise the largest generational cohort (154,603 or 23.1% of the total population)








2010 - 2021 Difference in Percent Registered Catholic Households






2010 - 2022 Difference in Percent Registered Catholic Households – Sioux Falls Focus




